Admin / updates

Judy Winslow reported that she and John Edwards received approval of funding from the Board of Historic Smithfield in the amount of \$1000 per year for two years.

Project updates

Judy suggested we compile a database of perspective contacts and asked each project team member to come to next month's meeting with five (5) types of businesses and a person to contact. **Homework** team.

Judy Winslow gave an update on the "Grand Re-Opening of Smithfield" meeting. The suggested theme name is "Everything Old is New Again. She outlined the events that could be planned and the team members suggested a date of Saturday, June 23, 2012. This will be the weekend prior to Olden Days, which will occur on June 29th, and 30th. At the March meeting Judy will tell us the firm date and the events planned for the Grand Re-Opening. The porcine statuary will be shrouded after artwork is completed and they will be unveiled during the Grand Re-Opening.

Peter indicated that the town has been in contact with the owner and would pursue the matter with Bill Hopkins and William Saunders.
